## Farmer kills self at dharna against stubble fire FIRs

Was under ₹10-lakh debt, union demands relief

**JAITO (FARIDKOT), DECEMBER 7**  
A farmer who had been on a protest dharna along with others in Jaito demanding cancellation of FIRs in stubble burning cases allegedly committed suicide by consuming some pesticide today. The deceased, Jagseer Singh (52) was a resident of Kotra Korianwala village in Bathinda. He owned 3 acres of land and was under a debt of about Rs 10 lakh. He had joined the BKU-Sidhupur group's dharna going on for over a month at the Tehsil Complex here on Thursday, said Jagjeet Singh Dallewal, state president of the union. He is survived by his wife, two sons and two daughters.

### WHY THE PROTEST

victim's family was adequately compensated.

It is alleged that Jagseer Singh ended his life by consuming some pesticide which he had bought from a shop situated close to the dharna site. He reportedly drank the poisonous chemical and walked to the site where he collapsed.

The Additional Deputy Commissioner and Faridkot SP reached the civil hospital and tried to prevail upon the protesting farmers, but the latter remained adamant on their demands.

Earlier, the protesters alleged that the state government had failed to provide any permanent solution to the problem of stubble burning. "Had it been the time of any election, no one would have dared to lodge a single case against any farmer in the matter," claimed a farm union leader.

### Wanted to claim insurance; mislead police

The body was earlier identified to be that of Anoop Singh (27), who belongs of an Amritsar-based business family. A case under Sections 302 and 201 IPC was registered on the statement of "Barlok Singh, Anoop's father.

Dhruv Dahiya, SSP, said here today that the family

had misled the police by identifying the body as that of Anoop's but the body was that of migrant labourer Babba, who lived near the family's house. The SSP said the accused were Anoop Singh, his brother Karandeep Singh and their domestic help Karan.

## HC slaps ₹1-lakh costs on Agri Dept officials

Taking cognizance of inordinate delay in filing complaint under the Insecticides Act, the Punjab and Haryana High Court has slapped costs of Rs 1 lakh. The amount is to be deposited by officers/officials responsible for causing the delay. The direction came in a case where the complaint was filed after a delay of more than four years and eight months.

Dismissing the complaint, Justice Harnarain Singh Gill made it clear that responsibility would be fixed by the Agriculture Director within a month of receiving the order. The costs would then be deposited by the erring officers/officials with Sangrur District Legal Services Authority.

The matter was brought to the High Court's notice after two petitions were filed by Raj Kumar Gupta and other petitioners. The counsel for the petitioners argued that the sample was drawn on August 20, 2013, and the

report of public analyst was dated September 5, 2013. But the complaint was instituted on May 9, 2018, after four years, eight months and four days. He further argued that the offences carried punishment up to two years. As such, the present complaint was not maintainable. Besides, there was no application of mind by the court below while passing the summoning order, counsel argued.

Justice Gill asserted: "The court finds that the continuation of the complaint and the consequential proceedings arising there from against the petitioners in both petitions are not legally justified and sustainable because the delay in filing the complaint cannot be brushed aside."

Justice Gill added that the present proceedings had rather resulted in the misuse of the process of law, defeating the ends of justice. Accordingly, the complaint and all consequential proceedings arising there from were liable to be quashed.

## 8 held with drugs

The police today seized 60,000 sedative tablets from two persons near the Pakistan border. The accused have been identified as Inderjeet Gaggu and his cousin Phool Chand.

A 35-year-old private medical practitioner, Hardev Bishnoi, was arrested for possessing 18,000 sedative tablets, 1,200 cough syrup bottles and Rs

20,000. Het Ram of Gidderanwala village was caught with 200 sedative tablets. Pyari Bai and her nephew Kalu Singh of Sukhera Bodla village, near Jalalabad, were nabbed with 8-kg poppy husk. A retired cop, Mahabir Bishnoi, was arrested in Sadhuwala village after one Prem Sharma told the police that Mahabir had arranged drugs for him. — OC

## 5-day remand for accused in heroin haul

The NIA brought on production warrant two persons in the smuggling of 532-kg heroin and produced them in an NIA court here on Saturday. The court remanded the two accused, Sandeep Kaur and Nirbhail Singh, to five-day police custody. NIA prosecutor Surinder Singh argued that various aspects of the case were to be probed. — TNS

## Sharpshooter held for killing BJP leader

## 2 policemen suspended for negligence

Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Mandeep Singh Sidhu has suspended Samana Station House Officer (SHO) Sahib Singh and ASI Jai Parkash for negligence in the registration of a case after recovery of 1,020 narcotic drugs from a man. The action has been taken after a preliminary investigation was carried out by Superintendent of Police (Investigation) Harmeet Singh Hundal.

Hundal said the officials had nabbed the man and recovered narcotic drugs from him but had failed to follow the FIR procedure properly, besides delaying the registration of the case.

The case was registered against Sukhwinder Singh (Sukha) of Samana who ran a meat shop after the police acted on a tip-off and recovered drugs from his possession. However, after the case was registered, accused Sukhwinder filed a petition in the Punjab and Haryana High Court, alleging he was falsely implicated. The court sent directions to the police for an investigation.
