## Doctor, driver die in car crash

Bareilly: A doctor and his driver were killed after a speeding sand-laden truck crashed into their car on Sambhal-Behjoi road near Kisuuli village in Sambhal district on Friday morning.

Manish Varshney and his driver Deepu were killed on the spot. His wife, Dr Shikha Agrawal, sustained minor injuries. She said they were going to Delhi to buy a car. The truck driver fled after the accident, leaving his vehicle behind.

"The truck driver lost control of the vehicle and crashed into the car. We have lodged an FIR against the absconding truck driver imposing it," said Ravindra Pratap Singh, SHO, Behjoi police station.

## Health camps to come up at villages near Nepal border

Pilibhit Officials On Toes After Nepal Confirms 1st Coronavirus Case

Bareilly: The health department will organize health camps at 26 villages in Pilibhit near the Nepal border, to rule out the spread of Novel Coronavirus (nCoV-2019).

The doctors will conduct health check-up at these villages to see if any person has symptoms related to the virus. Besides, ASHA workers have started conducting awareness drive to visit the hospital if anyone has a fever.

As Nepal reported one confirmed case of Novel Coronavirus, officials are taking precautionary measures so that the virus does not spread in Pilibhit, which shares the border with Nepal. In India, one confirmed case was reported in Kerala.

Additional director (health), Bareilly division, Dr Rakesh Dubey, said, "We have set up two mobile medical units at check-posts in Pilibhit to screen people entering India through the Indo-Nepal border for novel coronavirus. Apart from that, health camps will be conducted in villages bordering Nepal. In the health camps, screening of fever and other symptoms will be done to rule out the spread of novel coronavirus."

Chief medical officer (CMO), Pilibhit, Dr Seema Agarwal, said, "A team comprising a doctor, pharmacist and lab technician will hold health camps in 26 villages. ASHA workers will conduct cluster meetings with residents of these villages to educate them about the disease. We will distribute pamphlets and put up flexes to create awareness."

Meanwhile, the health department in Bareilly has issued advisory to the public. CMO, Bareilly, Dr Vineet Shukla, said, "The risk is in the districts having airport or those sharing the border with Nepal, but we are also alert. We have issued an advisory to the public and set up an isolation ward at the district hospital. Besides, we have sent the guidelines on novel coronavirus to all community health centres, IMA, private pathologies, and private medical colleges to notify us if they find any suspected case."

Health officials said the nCov virus spreads when a person sneezes and the infected droplets fall on nearby objects like tables or mobile phones. When healthy people touch these objects, they get infected.

Experts said people can reduce the risk of coronavirus by cleaning hands with soap and water or alcohol-based hand rub. Besides, one should cover his nose and mouth with a tissue when coughing and sneezing, and should not reuse the handkerchiefs or tissues. People should avoid close contact with anyone with cold or flu-like symptoms.

There should be no unprotected contact with live wild or farm animals, and people should eat thoroughly cooked meat and egg. Officials said nCov symptoms include fever, difficulty in breathing, chest pain, and rapid heartbeat.

## With webcast in place, more than 2L pupils brace up for UP boards

Bareilly: A total of 2,74,035 students will appear for class X and class XII exams in Bareilly division for UP board at 390 exam centres. As the state government has decided to webcast the examination process at all centres, the control rooms have been set up in Bareilly, Budaun, Pilibhit and Shahjahanpur. The board exams will be held from February 18 to March 6.

Joint director (secondary education), Bareilly division, Pradeep Kumar, said, "This will be the first time when the proceedings of all examination halls will be webcast during UP board exams."

For webcasting of exam centres, a control room has been set up at the office of district inspector of schools (DIOS). Besides, five flying squads have been made for random inspection of centres during exams in Bareilly.

Each flying squad would have four members, including two women. Apart from the district flying squad, three additional flying squads have been constituted for the divisional level.

Of 2, 74, 035 lakh students registered for UP board exams in Bareilly division, the highest is in Bareilly district with 96,913 students, followed by Shahjahanpur with 75,377 students, Budaun with 69,087 students and Pilibhit with 42,658 students.

Similarly, out of 390 exam centres listed in Bareilly division, 31 are government schools, 140 government-aided schools and 219 are private schools. Bareilly has 131 exam centres, Shahjahanpur (75), Budaun (47) and Pilibhit (34).

The total number of students to take class X and XII exams of UP board in Bareilly division has slightly decreased than last year. In 2019, 2, 74, 460 students were registered for class X and XII in Bareilly division while 400 exam centres were listed last year.

## PTR seeks nod to translocate tigers living in Amaria cane fields

Bareilly: Pilibhit Tiger Reserve (PTR) authorities have written to principal chief conservator of forests (wildlife) for translocating tigers that have made the sugarcane fields in Amaria block home. Forest officials said 10 tigers are living amid the cane fields and fear that if the big cats are not shifted, it may lead to human-tiger conflict in the area. Of these, four are sub-adults.

According to forest officials, nearly 50 tigers, including the 10 in Amaria, are living in the cane fields in Pilibhit district.

Giving details, chief conservator of forests, Rohilkhand zone, Lalit Verma told TOI, "If our proposal is approved, it will be first time that sugarcane tigers will be translocated. However, it is yet to be decided where the tigers will be shifted."

are translocated from there and if it will lead to a rise in population of wild boars or nilgai. Besides, we will ask senior officials to take help in the translocation process."

Officials said tigers were first spotted in Amaria, an agriculture belt, in 2012 when a tigress with three cubs strayed there. Located about 18 km from Pilibhit Tiger Reserve (PTR) and 20 km from Surai range of Terai East forest division of Uttarakhnad, Amaria's sugarcane fields offer a perfect refuge for tigers for breeding.

It is no wonder that over the years, the number of big cats has increased here. As the number of tigers has increased here, forest officials fear that if big cats are not shifted elsewhere, it may increase the risk of man-animal conflict. "We have adopted a few precautionary measures to minimize man-tiger conflict. Our forest staff regularly checks on Amaria," said Verma.
